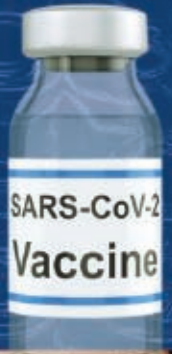

Weekly Progress (18th - 25th January)

The Covid-19 vaccination team at Aneurin Bevan University Health Board and our GP practices continue to work tirelessly on the biggest vaccination programme we have seen in our lifetime.

Across our Health Board we have now vaccinated a total of 48,841 people.



To date we have vaccinated residents from 89 care homes for older adults, and staff from 90 care homes for older adults across our Health Board. Older adult care homes we haven't yet been able to go to are continually being risk assessed and we will vaccinate those staff and residents as soon as it is safe for us to do so.

We have vaccinated over 20,471 people aged 80 and over and over 14,000 frontline staff.

Last week our fifth vaccination centre opened in Newport.

Our vaccination centre at Newport vaccinated a number of domiciliary care staff, as well as those aged over 80 years – they even played relevant music to the appropriate age cohort.

Two RAF veterans, Ronald Maidment and Ronald Percival, both 93, received their vaccinations at an Aneurin Bevan University Health Board vaccination centre recently.

Mr Maidment joined the RAF in 1945. He said, *"It was a nice surprise to see RAF here helping give out the vaccine"*. His daughter Karen added, *"Dad was so pleased to see the RAF here and it's been very well organised. It's a day to remember in history"*.

Former RAF Sergeant Ronald Percival, served across the world with the RAF in his 22-year service. He commented, *"I really enjoyed my time in the RAF and it was wonderful to see them here today helping people get a vaccine."*



The Week Ahead (25th January - 1st February)

With the good progress being made in vaccinating those age 80 years and over during this week, our GP colleagues will complete offering vaccinations to this age group. This has enabled us to speed up the delivery of the vaccine programme. As a result, we have been able to start inviting priority group 3; those age between 75 and 79.

This week we have a planned supply of 22,150 vaccine. We are also opening a vaccination centre in Newbridge this weekend.

If you receive an appointment, please do everything you can to attend as we are vaccinating thousands of people every week.

Mobile Teams

The mobile vaccination teams consist of professionals with varied health care backgrounds, including pharmacists, mental health nurses, dental assistants and more.

Team Operational Manager, Angela, praised her team highly *"I'm in complete awe of this team. The effort they all put in is just incredible, and they are all so determined to vaccinate as many patients as quickly and safely as they possibly can. They are volunteering to work extra hours at short notice and vaccinating staff at the end of their shifts, just because they want to help"*.

We continue to develop our booking centre process and call centre. We are increasing capacity to improve the service we offer. We are aware the lines can be very busy at times.

The Duke of Cambridge, HRH Prince William, took the opportunity to thank Aneurin Bevan University Health Board's Mass Vaccination Team this week, in a telephone call with the Programme Director, Mererid Bowley.

Aneurin Bevan University Health Board's Assistant Director of Public Health, Mererid Bowley, represented the Mass Vaccination Team on the call, where she provided the Duke with updates on the success of the Mass Vaccination Programme.
